
I also went to Federation Square last week to watch the final Songroom concert for the year, which was shown on TV last Sunday. I was very proud to see our students performing two lovely songs.




Emotion Coaching: The key to building children into healthy and successful adults


Emotional Intelligence is the ability to recognise our own and other people's emotions. It helps us and our children to act with compassion, empathy and understanding.
